 Day Use, Family Camping, Kitchen, Group rates, Family Season Pass for Day Use and Camping

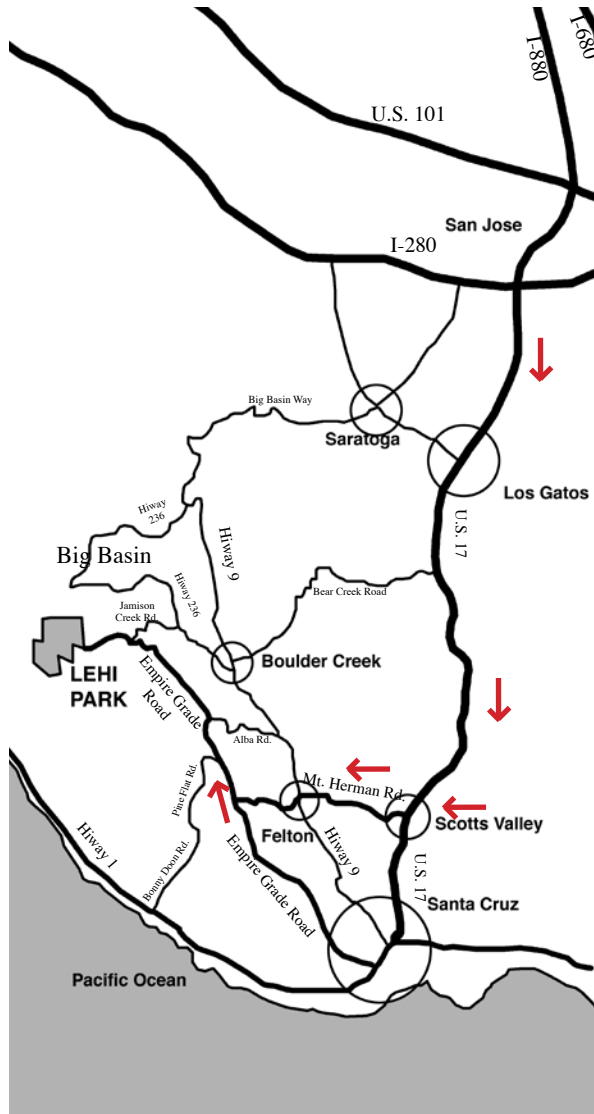
Wards participating in maintenance work projects may camp without fees.

 Drive .1 miles, go straight at stop light, road becomes  
 Felton Empire Rd. Continue up this winding road.  
 Drive 3.7 miles to Empire Grade Rd. Turn right  
 Drive 8.7 miles to end of road, Lehi gate is on the right.

# Lehi Park

Lehi Park is over 1000 acres of beautiful mountain property located in the Santa Cruz Mountains, near the towns of Felton and Boulder Creek. It is owned by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and operated by several LDS Stakes.

LDS Ward and Stake groups, families and individuals can have access and use the park every month of the year for girls camps, youth and adult retreats and seminars, youth conferences, ward, stake, and scout camp outs, family camping and family reunions. Chapel areas in secluded redwood groves are ideal for church and devotional services.

Facilities at Lehi Park:  
 63 Campsites, each with a table and BBQ.  
 Water is close to each campsite. Large Kitchen and dining facilities that can accommodate

# How to get to Lehi Park

First, call Lehi Park at 831-423-7313 for reservations and gate combination.

From San Jose the recommended route to Lehi Park:

Take Hiway 17 south, exit at Mt. Herman Road in Scotts Valley. Turn right. Follow it 3.7 miles through town and down the hill into Felton where the road ends at Graham Hill Road. Turn right onto Graham Hill Road. Drive .1 miles. At the light be in the center lane, cross over Hiway 9, and go straight, up the hill. This is now Felton Empire Road. Drive 3.7 miles up this road as it winds its way up to the top of the ridge. At the stop sign turn right onto Empire Grade Road. Follow this 8.7 miles to where the road ends at the Lockheed gate. Don't go in to Lockheed. The gate to Lehi is on the right.

Give yourself about an hour and fifteen minutes to drive up. Allow more time if there is heavy traffic, such as on Friday afternoons.

There are other ways to get to Lehi Park. These have narrow winding roads that are also known as the car sick routes, which is why we recommend using hiway 17.

To open the gates to Lehi Park you must have the gate combination which changes every month.

The first gate has a number of padlocks on it. The Lehi lock is the 2nd one from the left. It is a combination lock that has four number wheels. Set the numbers for the combination, squeeze the shackle down and the lock should pop open. Remove the lock. Slide the latch with the other locks on it to the right. Push the gate open, drive through and then close the gate. Always close the gate after going through it. It is not to be left open. Replace the lock. Reset the number wheels to 0, and then close the shackle. Drive along the dirt road 1.2 miles into the park, following the signs. Go past a short section of paved road and a gate on the left that connects to the neighboring Lockheed property. Do not enter this gate, nor go into the Lockheed property. Keep going until you reach the big Lehi Park signs and the second locked gate (same combo as the first). Just inside this gate is a bulletin board where you can pay the camping fees and read about what is happening at the park. From this gate there is a paved road leading .3 miles to Helaman Hall and the Zarahemla campsites.
